SEVERE ICE STORMS HIT IOWA, DOWNING ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION LINES

CHALLENGE

When severe ice storms hit lowa, electric transmission lines managed by three rural electrical cooperatives and one municipal utility were compromised. After these ice storms pummeled the area, all four utilities qualified for FEMA funds to support emergency repairs to communities in dangerous conditions. However, financial support for permanent restoration was denied.

SOLUTION
